

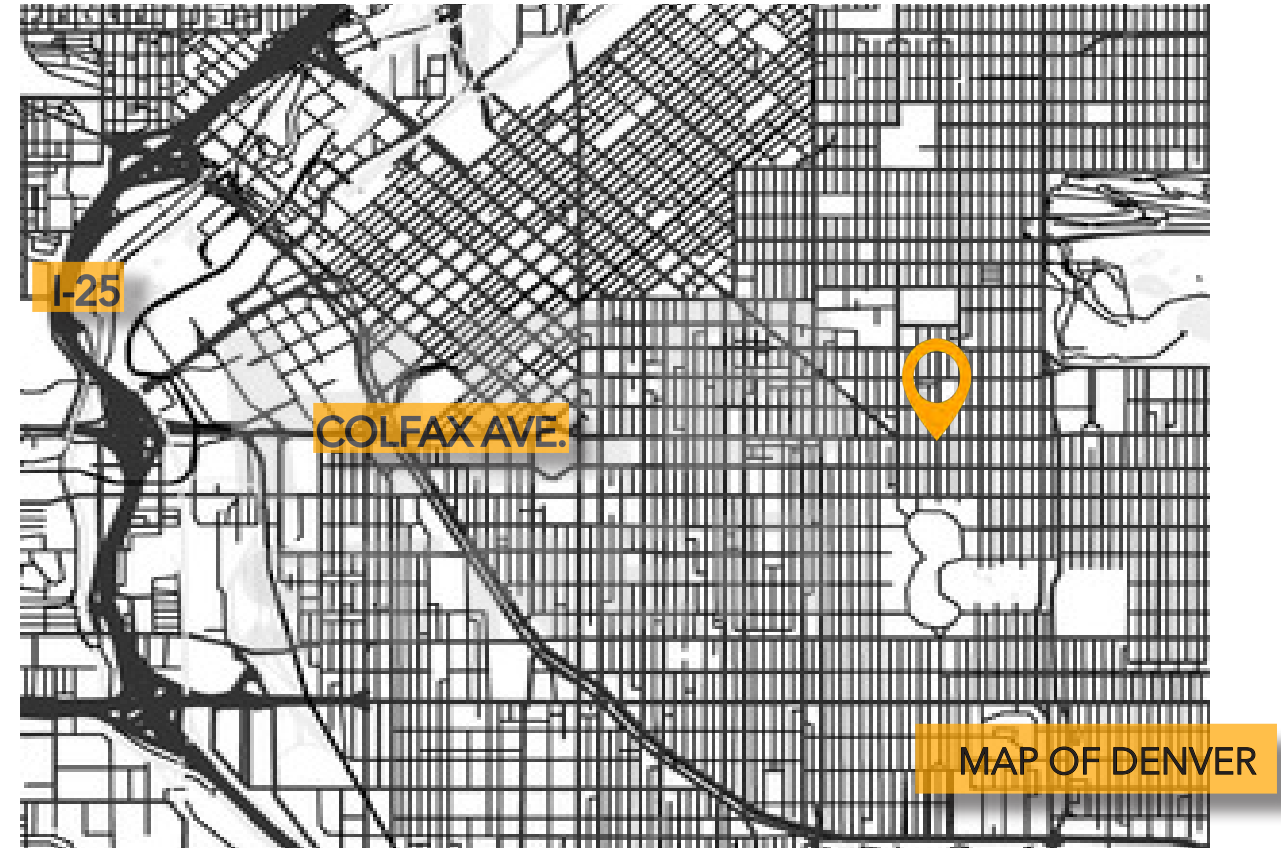

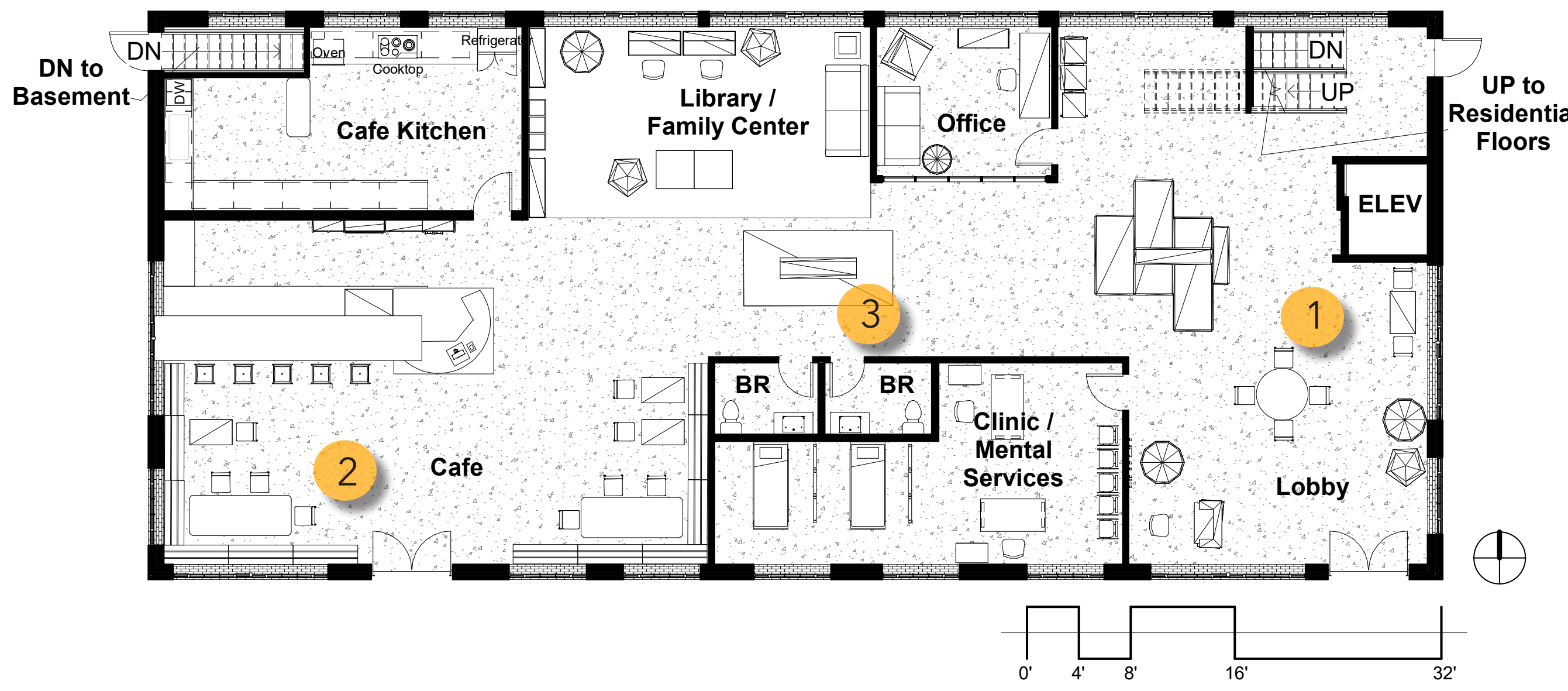
Safe Haven is a multi use community center and integrated housing for homeless families and individuals. They provide individualized support services from mental health to family services, to create a stable environment to keep those who were once homeless in housing. Day lockers and shower rooms are provided in the basement for those who need a place to get washed up and store their belongings for a few hours. A community garden and pay-it-forward cafe reside on the first floor of the building with access to the general public and community center. A library and clinic take up the remainder of the first floor. The second through fifth floors are hostel-like living quarters. Single, double, and family rooms are provided depending on the residents comfort levels and for any families with lower incomes. The floors have a maximum of 12 rooms on each floor with some communal space. Safe Haven is dedicated to helping those at-risk individuals before it is too late. Pulling from design theories and previous design projects these design solutions that are affordable, sustainable and community oriented.

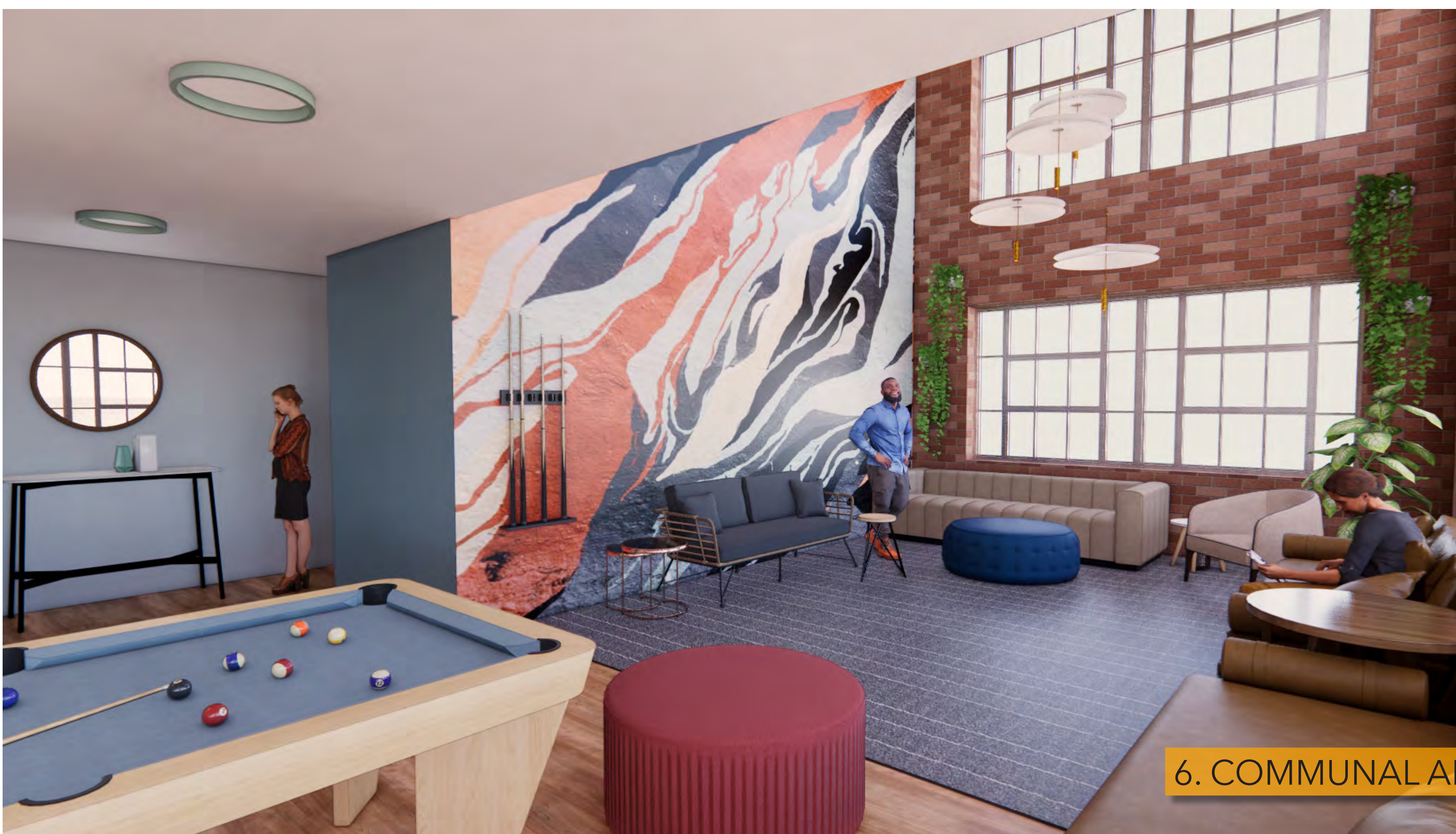

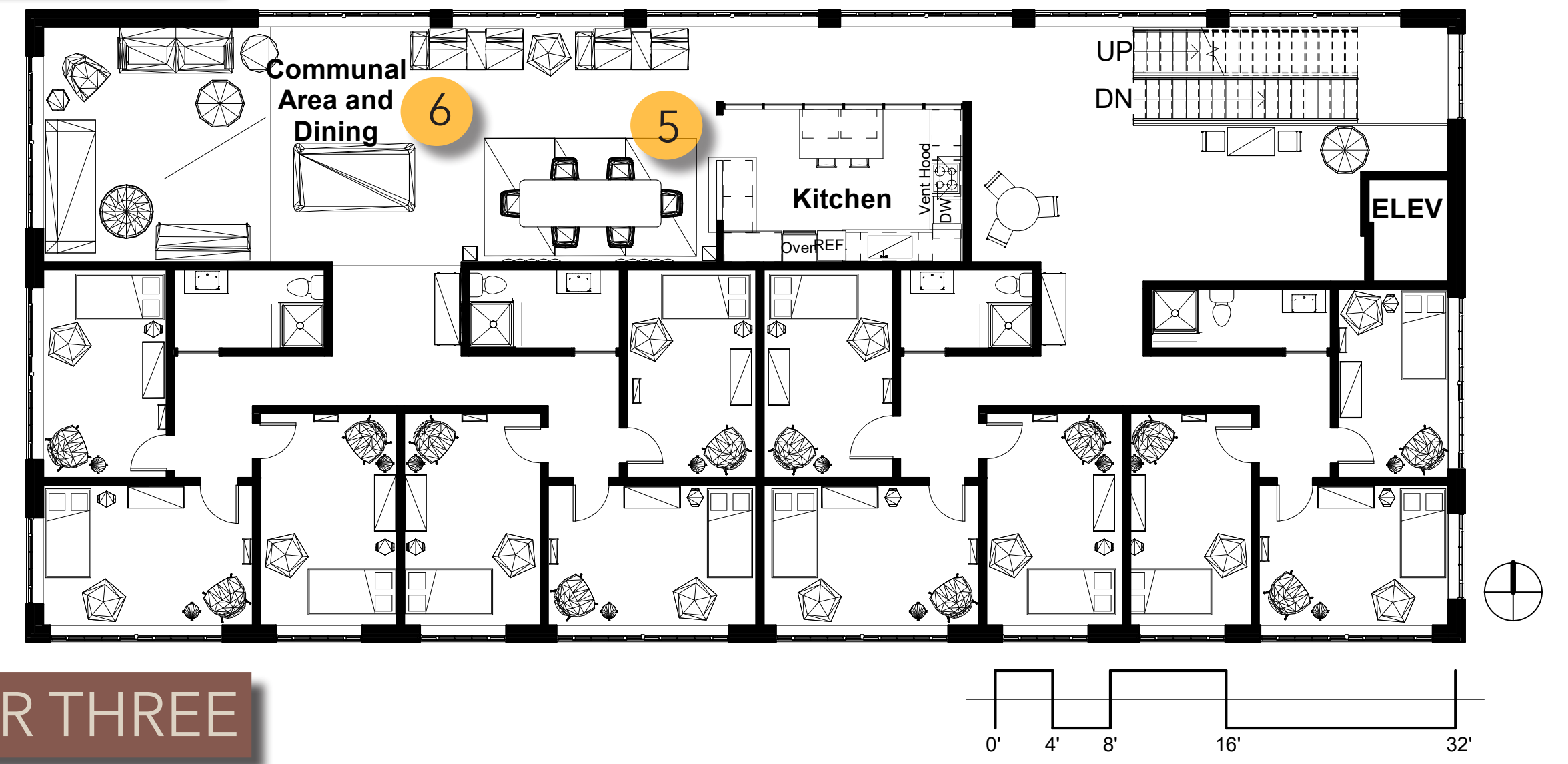

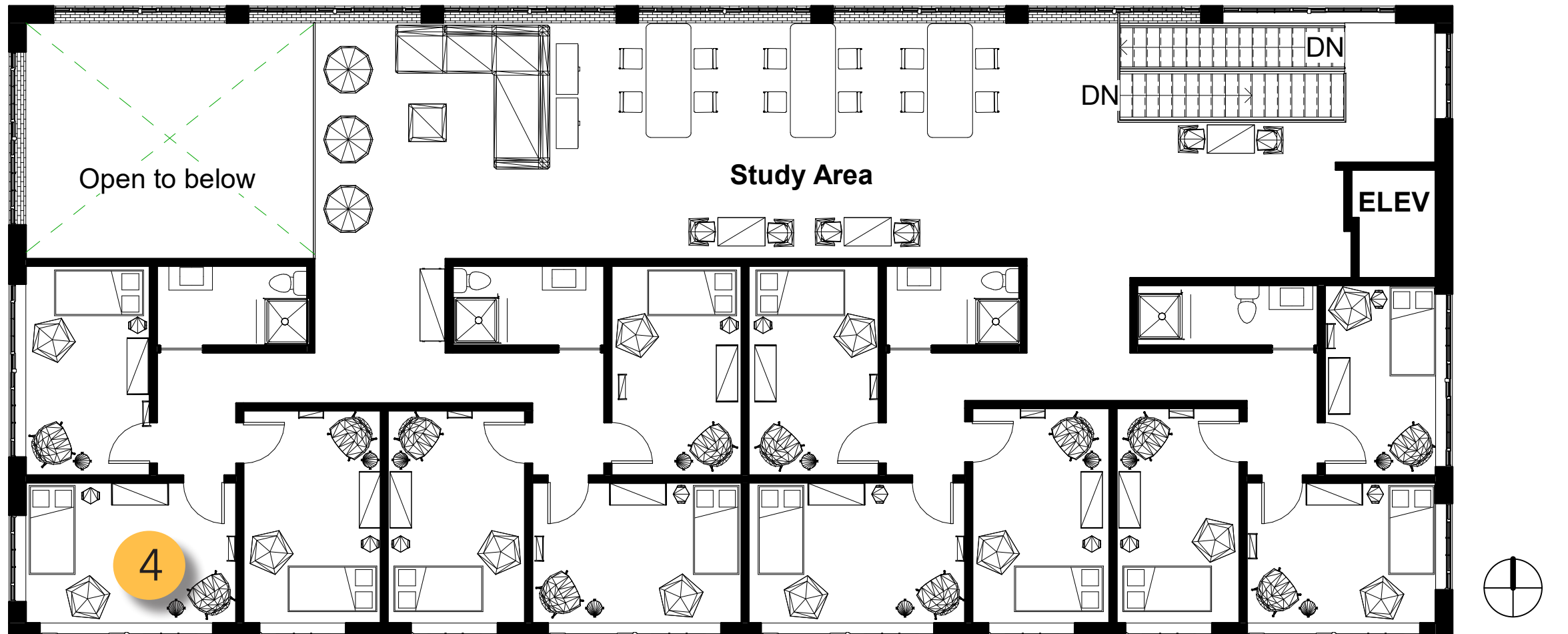
